WHAT A FOOL BELIEVES

Proverbs 14:1 The fool says in his heart, "There is no God."

P erhaps you saw the story about the resignation of yet another board member of the Freedom From Religion Foundation(FFRF). Joining high-profile atheist authors Richard Dawkins and Steven Pinker, evolutionary biologist Jerry Coyne has resigned in disgust after publishing an article, "Biology is not Bigotry." The article is a strong affirmation of the "faith" of scientists—that gender is biologically defined and determined.

Unfortunately for him and the other Atheist luminaries, that doctrine is no longer part of the FFRF Book of Confessions. Their anti-Faith faith has evolved beyond them, and they are suddenly as vestigial as wisdom teeth.

These popular intellectuals have been dissed by the idealists of progressive sexuality. For the FFRF, science matters less than the new ideology.

So what happens when the core foundation of atheism is no longer science? On what grounds does atheism object to religion when it takes on unscientific doctrines as its truth claims? In short, it becomes a belief system without rational foundations. The Freedom From Religion Foundation becomes a religion—and the irony is glaringly obvious to all except fools wallowing in their own foolishness.

Malcolm Muggeridge (ex-atheist misquoting ex-atheist G.K. Chesterton) said it well: When men cease to believe in God they do not then believe in nothing, but in anything.

Perhaps you saw the story about a recent fracas in Topeka, Kansas wherein the leader of a small group of self-described satanists and three other people were arrested Friday following a scuffle inside the Kansas Statehouse arising from an effort by the group's leader to start a Black Mass in the rotunda.

The story noted that an another non-satanist Kansan (perhaps from FFRF?) jumped up to smack the fake anti-communion wafter out of the hand of the high priest, who in turn landed two punches on the other citizen. The satanist was arrest for assault (Satanists don't turn the other cheek).

The Satanists—there and elsewhere—have been allowed to openly practice anti-Catholic "Satanism" under the aegis of the First Amendment. When "Freedom From Religion" fails to slake one's demonic thirst, the next step is an Anti-religion—just as rigid, inflexible, and judgmental as fundamentalist Puritanism.

I don't know what that good Kansas wafersmacker said to the police during the investigation, but I'd like to imagine it went something like this:

Detective: "Why did you smack the wafer from that man's hand?"

Kansan: "He was attempting to desecrate the Holy Catholic Mass."

Detective: "Don't you believe in freedom of religion? It is protected by the First Amendment." Kansan: "Yeah, but it doesn't count here."

Detective: "Why not?"

Kansan: "Because come on!—they're Satanists!"

They're Satanists. There is not a single Founding Father or Mother who wouldn't have delivered a similar smack. They all believed in Freedom of Religion, but did so with basic Christianity in mind. We find they were tolerant, but not particularly keen on any of the non-European religious traditions.

If some fool had been daft enough to have asked James Madison, author of the First Amendment, "Does that include Satan worship?" They would have smacked him as well, because, come on, they're Satanists!

Some things used to be considered "self-evident," but such truths are now hard to pin down.

In 1940, Prof. Walter Kotschnig told Holyoke College students to keep their minds open—"but not so open that your brains fall out."

People uncertain about God tend toward poor judgment.





Have you ever thought about wanting to change something about yourself? Mayybe be more outgoing or a happier person — or improve your relationships? Have you then told yourself, "Well, that's just me. I can't change who I am." That's simply not true, says Maria Amaya, therapist at Samaritan Counseling Center in Upland. "Our brains can change," she says, "and there's a lot of hope in that."

Dr. Amaya will be joining us on Friday, April 11, to talk about senior depression and related mental health issues common among the older population. "So many people don't understand what depression looks like," she explained. "And if you haven't had a lot of information, you can be mislead. We <u>can</u> retrain our brain."

Dr. Amaya has been with Samaritan Counseling since 2022. With a doctor of social work from Capella University and a master of social work from the University of Southern California, she brings over two decades of experience to her role at Samaritan. Using a whole person therapeutic approach, Dr. Amaya works with individuals, couples, and families to help them adopt healthier ways of thinking and living. "I enjoy providing the tools of hope to help [my clients] establish a new path to healthier relationships," she says.

Join us Friday, April 11, to learn what depression is really all about. Bring your questions! Remember we are back to our regular start time of 11:00. After a few worship songs and a devotion, Dr. Amaya will speak. Then we will enjoy a brown bag lunch and fellowship. Beverages are provided – or you can bring your own.
